



Interstate Deployment Operations for Domestic Response Course

Course Description: A three day (24-hour) informational course designed for Joint Forces Headquarters-State (JFHQ-State), Joint Task Force – State (JTF-State), and Major Subordinate Commands (MSC) Staffs involved with planning, supporting or directing deployment operations. The Course takes a doctrinal approach to Deployment and Redeployment Operations tempered with practical application of Tactics Techniques and Procedures (TTPs) unique to Domestic Operations in the states. Instruction includes an analysis of recent lessons learned and TTPs in planning and executing abbreviated, remote and/or virtual deployment operations including the Joint Reception, Staging, Onward-movement, and Integration (JRSOI) phase. A review of collaborative, web-based tools, shared sites, VTC/teleconferences and other forms of technology that may expedite deployment operations and a review of the Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC) and the roles and responsibilities of the supporting and supported states, the NGB and other mission partners are key elements of the course instruction.

Prerequisites: While there are no formal prerequisites, an understanding of the host state's concept of operations for all-hazard's Domestic/Emergency Operations is recommended. Additionally, students are encouraged to review *JP 3-35, Deployment and Redeployment Operations* and *JP 4-01.8, Joint Tactics, Techniques and Procedures for Joint Reception, Staging, Onward Movement, and Integration* prior to Course attendance.

Target Audience: This course is intended for personnel involved with planning, supporting or directing Deployment and Redeployment Operations for domestic emergency operations.

Course Objectives: Based on the host command's requirements, the Program of Instruction objectives typically include the following:

1. Understand the basic civil emergency management and the National Guard Defense Support of Civil Authorities (DSCA) architecture and concept of operations, from the local level to the federal level.
2. Understand the inter-state mutual aid roles and responsibilities of the NGB, State Emergency Management, JFHQs-State, JTF-State and the responsible JRSOI Command/Task Force as they relate to and influence deployment operations.
3. Understand deployment operations concepts and requirements relative to domestic operations.
4. Understand the essential elements and key tasks of each phase of deployment operations.
5. Be able to plan and develop state unique, doctrinally sound, fully coordinated and nested Deployment Operations Plans (OPLANS).
